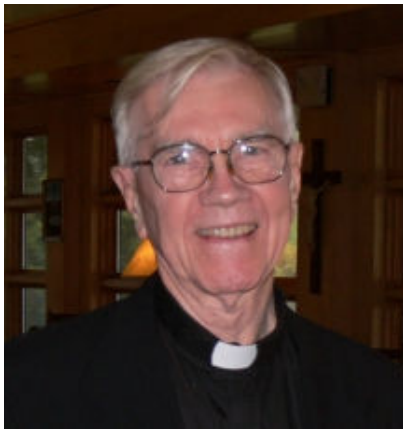
4th Degree Christmas Dinner Dance
